## HOW TO TEST THAT YOUR VESSEL IS VITREOUS/WATERTIGHT

As we are getting ready for our exhibition at Matariki we want to make sure that work submitted is watertight and fit for purpose. Take your pot, fill it with water (keep the outside dry) and set it on a kitchen towel. Leave for three days, then lift pot and see how your kitchen towel looks. Is it dry and only has slight rim impression or has it got a damp imprint of footring or base?

### CLASSES

### The pottery club currently has 5 weekly classes on offer. Demand for all classes is high, with waiting lists in place.

Led by Alex Prentice, our Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday evening classes cater to a diverse range of student abilities. Alex is a master at teaching an array of techniques, from hand-building to molds and wheel work, with a variety of methods for decorating and glazing.

Students in Monday's beginners wheel class with Dianne Macdonald are busy developing skills and producing a range of forms. We are fortunate to have Di, an extremely skilled and experienced production potter, as a tutor.

Looking ahead to the future, we have additional classes lined up. In Term 3, Shona Clarkson will lead a Thursday class on glaze development, making and testing. There are still spaces available in this class, details on next page. Lesley Towart will teach a sculpture class in Term 4. Renate will take her Saturday morning monthly intermediate wheel class in Terms 3 and 4. There is one space available details on next page.

All our hard work will be showcased at the All Classes Exhibition in November, and we can't wait to see the amazing works on display. Thank you to everyone who has joined us on this journey of learning and creativity.

This means plenty of time to make pots, and prepare them for firing with terra sigillata or use hard polished stones to try burnishing. So come along to Club Night demo on Tuesday June 13 to learn about pit firing, what vessels are best and how to prepare your works for firing.

#### TERM 3 GLAZE CLASS WITH SHONA CLARKSON

When: Thursdays 9.30-11.30am from 20 July, (6 weeks)

Learn how to make, mix and what materials go into a glaze. We will be altering some materials in the glaze each time we make it up. making a clear, white and coloured glaze with a touch of texture. We will be testing about 30 tests per recipe and firing to see the samples at cone 6.

Focus will be improving technical skills and speed in production. Participants will work on their own individual projects developing your own unique style, preference of form and design. Improving wheel work skills including centering, shape repetitions, achieving desired shapes with a focus on dishes including functional baking dishes/casseroles, with (or without) handles, lids and knobs.

This is a brilliant space and the very best of our pots are on show and look fantastic.


### MT PLEASANT POTTERY GALLERY OPEN 11AM UNTIL 3PM - SATURDAY & SUNDAY

### **CLUB DEMONSTRATION NIGHTS**

#### Here is a recap of the sessions we've had so far this year:

We kicked off the year in February with our "Making your Mark" workshop with Leigh-Ann. An enjoyable time to get-together, have a chat, drinks and nibbles while we made ceramic stamps for pot decoration.

In March, Ken Doidge, our glazing guru, gave a workshop on the basics of making your own glazes, with a focus on iron glazes. Hee answered questions on how to make them, how to modify them, and how they work. Ken is always incredibly informative. A great opportunity to learn from an expert.

Andrew Carran's club night demo in April was a taster for his May two-day weekend workshop. Andrew talked about his decision to focus his practice on hand-building, which was inspired by Japanese techniques. He also discussed his process of problem-solving to achieve desired forms and decorative effects. Throughout the presentation, Andrew showed a range of his pots, including bowls, cups and sculptural forms. It was an inspiring and informative workshop, and we are looking forward to seeing more of Andrew's work at our Matariki Exhibition in July.

Most recently Gwen Parsons, from General Pottery, talked about what supplies are on offer including pottery classes coming up this year. Gwen brought in a range of products, including stamps and rollers, and answered many questions about clay types, their properties and application as well as glazes, underglazes, and slips and demonstrated their uses. Was good to see how best to apply underglaze transfers to slips.

We are grateful for the generosity of the many talented potters who give their time and expertise to our monthly club night sessions. Thank you to all who have come along and participated, and we look forward to seeing you at our upcoming Club Night Demonstrations...


# WORKSHOP WITH MARY LOU FOATE

Mary Lou Foate led a two-day workshop in which we learnt handwork, decoration and glazing techniques to create 3D designs on both flat clay surfaces and around the surface of the ball, giving our creations a unique and dynamic look.

We explored different ways to decorate our clay creations using many found objects such as screws, rawls, and plugs to make small, intricate patterns. Mary Lou showed how to use these objects to create interesting textures and designs on the clay. She also demonstrated how to use coloured underglazes and slips to enhance the patterns and bring out their details. We were all delighted by our finished works

# HANDBUILDING WORKSHOP WITH ANDREW CARRAN

The two-day weekend hand-building workshop by Andrew Carran was a great success. During the first session, Andrew focused on preparing clay and pinching basic forms. Creating spheres by joining pinched bowls was straightforward, however getting them home unscathed provided a challenge. Managing drying of work is a key part of hand building, so we learned ways to control this to give workable forms for the second session. The second session required joining, paddling, and extending forms, which allowed the us to create more complex pieces. Many then worked towards more ambitious goals, with Andrew providing lots of little demos along the way.

Throughout the workshop, we created finished pots, both small and large, which will provide inspiration for our future projects. A highlight of the workshop was the production of a 'draped' bowl form, which looks easy but has many challenges in managing the drying and manipulation of the clay.

We thank Andrew for his contribution to the success of the workshop; sharing his expertise, guidance, and inspiration, and we look forward to his role as our guest exhibitor and judge for our upcoming Matariki Exhibition.


